Subject: Foreign seafarers can obtain a COVID-19 vaccine in Canada

Purpose

This bulletin is to let you know that COVID-19 vaccines remain available to everyone, including foreign seafarers, in Canada.

Scope

This bulletin applies to:

- shipping companies and agents responsible for vessels calling to Canadian ports, and
- foreign seafarers

What you need to know

COVID-19 vaccines approved for use in Canada continue to be widely available. Please consult Ship Safety Bulletin <u>06/2022</u> for guidelines respecting the mobility of asymptomatic, presumed non-Covid-19 carrying seafarers.

Vaccination is one of the most effective ways to protect our families, communities, coworkers and ourselves against COVID-19. Vaccines used in Canada are very effective at preventing severe illness, hospitalization and death from COVID-19.

Getting vaccinated can also reduce the likelihood of developing symptoms of post COVID-19 condition. Post COVID-19 condition, also known as long COVID, is when people still experience symptoms of COVID-19 for weeks or months after their initial recovery.
